


Literacy/Arts: In Jolly Phonics we have already covered group 1 (<u>S, A, T, I, P, N</u>). We love to sing the action song, sounding out the phonic every day and then we try to think of words that <u>begin</u> with these sounds. It would be great if you wanted to try this at home too to help us reinforce our learning! \* Each child will be given an Our Sounds/Phonics Copy very soon which will have all the sounds as we complete them as well as the actions for the songs and some sample words

## How can you support the great explorers & learners at home?

FYI: What is Jolly Phonics? Jolly Phonics is an interactive child-centred approach to teaching literacy using synthetic phonics. (Sounds taught individually then blended to form words). There are ACTIONS/SONGS for each of the 42 letter sounds. This supports memory retention (Check the SOUNDS notebook)! This multi-sensory method is very motivating for VARK Learners (Visual, Aural, Read/Write or Kinaesthetic). The letter sounds are split into 7 groups-Hear individual letter sounds by tapping the links on each button...In Jolly Phonics, the 42 main sounds of English are taught; not just the alphabet. The video below goes through all of these sounds, in English. Alternatively, you can listen to any of the letter sounds by clicking on the icons below the video. <u>Click</u> the icons below to hear each letter sound in British English. Alternatively, you can download all 42 letter sounds by <u>clicking</u> here.

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



Group 6 (x) (ch) (sh) (th) (th) (y) Group 7 (qu) (00) (ue) (er) (ar)
