# Grainne's Junior Infants September Woodstock ETNS Review

A month in already, it's crazy how the time flies! The children are settling in very nicely into Junior Infants. We've spent a lot of September implementing new routines and classroom procedures. The children now have classroom jobs which they take very seriously. I believe that these responsibilities are so important to encourage the children to take ownership of and pride in their class. It is going very well so far! Below is a brief overview of the work we have done over the month of September:

#### Literacy/Phonological Awareness

In line with our 'Roald Dahl' Aistear theme we have focused on reading Roald Dahl every day during storytime. We have done snippets from 'The Enormous Crocodile', 'The Twits' and 'George's Marvellous Medicine'. The children love this time of the day and I find it fantastic for promoting new vocabulary and encouraging critical thinking.

We have also focused hugely on developing their phonological awareness. The girls and boys have been working on rhyming words, using their bodies to count syllables and separating compound words eg. playground is separated into play and ground.







### Gaeilge

This year, we are doing the interactive Bua na Cainte programme. The children have really enjoyed the songs, poetry and games that this programme provides. We have also focused hugely on gaeilge neamhfhormúil (informal Irish). Their use of Irish in their everyday environment has been really wonderful thing to see grow and develop. The class were also introduced to Nelly Beag (Little Nelly) who only comes out during our Irish lessons.

Cé tusa? (Kay tussah) Who are you?

Is mise \_\_\_\_ (Iss misha\_\_\_\_) / am \_\_\_\_

Dia duit (Dee-a gwitch) Hello

Dia is muire duit (Dee-a is murra gwitch) Hello (response)









#### **Numeracy**

This month we worked a lot on matching and comparing objects according to height, weight, lengths, colour, quantity, thickness, size. The girls and boys also classified objects on the basis of one attribute such as colour, shape, texture and size. They have really enjoyed hands on learning and using our environment to learn new mathematical concepts.











#### Aistear

Our theme for September was 'Roald Dahl'. The children did loads of fun activities in the different stations (Construction, Smallworld, Fine Motor, Art, Maths, Science). They had great fun making magical crocodile skin and paperplate Roly Poly Birds, inspired by 'The Enormous Crocodile'. They used their creative skills to make 'The Twits' from playdough and used sensory materials to make Mr. Twit's gross beard. Inspired by 'George's Marvellous Medicine', the boys and girls also made their own potions made of magical ingredients. A lot of fun was had!
