Emma's Senior Infants – September Review

Dear Parents/Guardians,

What a super September! All the boys and girls in Senior Infants have settled so well into their new school year. We were thrilled to welcome both Alex and Ryan to our class, what wonderful additions. Below is a brief overview of what we got up to this month:

Literacy

During Literacy this month, we learned the difference between consonants and vowels. We revised group 1 (s, a, t, p, i, n) and group 2 (ck, e, h, r, m, d) of our jolly phonics programme and the children are practicing blending these sounds together using cvc (consonant, vowel, consonant) words.





Maths

During maths this month, the children revised their colours along with classifying objects for example a saucer belongs to a cup. The children have also been going over numbers 0, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 along with finding the different number bonds for these numbers.



Gaeilge

During Gaeilge this month, our theme was Mé Féin. The children learned the following phrases:

-Cé tusa? Is mise____.



-Cé hí sin? Cé hé sin? Sin í/é_____.

-Conas atá tú ? Tá mé go maith nó níl mé go maith.

The children have really enjoyed playing 'Deir Ó Grádaigh' which is Simon says in Gaeilge to learn some everyday phrases in Irish (Seasaigí, suigí, dúnaigí bhur súile, osclaigí bhur súile, téigí a chodladh).

Aistear

During September our theme has been Roald Dahl. The children have loved reading some of Roald Dahl's books – The Enormous Crocodile, The Twits and George's Marvellous Medicine. Some highlights from this theme were learning how to make 'crocodile skin' during science, making Mr. Twits beard during Art and making their very own potion inspired by George's Marvellous Medicine!
