### Student council

The school is setting up its first ever student council and the children in  $2^{nd}/3^{rd}$  class have been learning all about what a student council does and how it will benefit Woodstock ETNS. After hearing from the candidates, we held an election on Wednesday where two students from  $2^{nd}$  class and two students from  $3^{rd}$  class were elected. Elections will take place in other classes before the winter break. I am really looking forward to working with the student's council over the coming year.

In the picture below you can see some of the posters put up by our candidates. Each candidate was given the opportunity to present to the class before we held the election. The students showed great maturity and empathy when they discussed their vision for the student council.



#### **Gaeilge**

In October we put a big emphasis on the children's listening and speaking skills. I selected parts of the day where I only spoke in Irish. The children also used their knowledge of the language to speak Irish informally throughout the day. The children have really embraced this. Maith sibh!

#### <u>Literacy</u>

The children have just completed the PALS reading programme. For this the children were paired up and both given a book to read. Each child listened to the other child reading, they noted any unknown or interesting words as they read. Check out some of the interesting words we discovered in our books in the picture below.





#### Numeracy

During October we learnt all about addition and subtraction strategies. We used our **RUDE** (read, underline, draw, and estimate) procedure when completing different tasks. We also learnt about money and completed a lot of practical tasks associated with using money. On Friday morning the children focus on hands on maths tasks and games, this has helped them to reinforce what they have previously learnt in class.

#### <u>SESE</u>

This month we learnt all about Halloween (Samhain) and its origins in Ireland. The children discovered the differences between how it was celebrated in the past compared to today. They thought the costumes that people made in the past we really creative and some of them already knew that in Ireland we originally carved turnips not pumpkins.

As we are coming towards the winter we also focused on hibernating Irish animals. We specifically learnt about the long-eared bat and the hedgehog. We also completed artwork related to the topic.







## <u>Sport</u>

This month 3<sup>rd</sup> class participated in the school's cross-country championships. It was a really wet day which made it challenging, but the children embraced this and really enjoyed running through the mud and puddles. Massive congratulations to James Doyle, who won gold in the boy's race. James was in fourth place approaching the finish and put in an impressive sprint finish to claim gold!

Every second Monday the community hall and pitches are booked for Woodstock ETNS. I am currently doing training for 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> class. The training will relate to whatever sport the



school is competing in. Our next training is on the 6<sup>th</sup> of November, and we will be doing basketball.
