The children seemed to really enjoy both of the trips.

During our *Fighting Words* workshop the children worked together to create a story as a class. They voted on the title of the story and worked together to develop the plot. The facilitators talked to the children about all the different people who are involved in developing stories like the author, illustrator, and editor. For the second part of the workshop the children created their own stories. The effort and engagement on the day was very impressive and I know the children really enjoyed going to the Wicklow library.







Numeracy

During December the children focused on learning all about data, they also revised some other topics covered during the first term of school. There has been a focus on critical thinking in our maths work. With the children discussing questions orally, using hands on supports and plenty of estimating and working out. On Friday mornings the children still focus on hands on maths tasks and games, this has helped them to reinforce what they have previously learnt in class, we have added some new resources to the classroom which has made these games more engaging. An example of these resources are our spinners and the k'nex which have been kindly lent to us by Blackrock Education centre.






The K'nex have been used to make bridges with support gaps of 50cm, homes with doors and windows and even reindeer!










Check out our winter scenes we created using a variety of materials including recycled materials.
