A few notes for your diary:

I am delighted to inform you that the school has successfully secured funding from the Department of Social Protection, <u>School Meals Scheme</u>. This will fully fund the provision of a hot meal service at Woodstock ETNS. Freshtoday will be our lunch service provider. This Irish company is based in Enniscorthy, Co. Wexford since 2010. The timeline for delivery of the programme is still in progress but will most certainly be ready for September 2024. Please note this will be an opt in/opt out service so parents can choose whether to avail of the hot meals or provide their own packed lunches. Full details to follow soon.

Although this month has been one week shorter, we managed to fit a lot in! Please review a portion of what we covered this month in Junior Infants.

Literacy/Phonics

The girls and boys steamed ahead with Jolly Phonics in February. They also started vowel digraphs which can be difficult but they have worked extremely hard to gain fluency. The new sounds covered this month were: b, ai, j, oa, ie, ee/or.

The plan is to start sending reading books home after Easter so I ask that you ensure that all sounds are consolidated up to that point. Similarly, encouraging them to read and write words that contain their sounds is recommended eg. rain, coat, jam etc.





Gaeilge

This month we focused hugely on the theme 'Éadaí' (clothes). We learned phrases like:

- Cuir ort (Put on) Eg. Cuir ort do chóta (put on your coat)
- Bain díot (take off) Eg. Bain díot do hata (take off your hat

They love acting out their phrases so I would encourage this at home!



We have 'Seachtain na Gaeilge' in March so they will be getting phrases to practice as part of homework. More information on this will be given.



Numeracy

This month, we have been working hugely on number. Below are some of the objectives we've covered:

- Order sets of objects by number, 1–5.
- Use the language of ordinal number: first and last
- Partitioning numbers 1 5 activities with objects of different colours, sizes etc







We had a few Aistear themes for February – 'Chinese New Year', 'Valentine's Day' and 'I am an Engineer'
