Senior Infants – February Review

It is crazy to think we are more than half way through our academic year! Time has flown by. Below is a brief overview of what we got up to during February.

Literacy

During Literacy this month, we have been focusing on the following vowel digraphs: ai, oa, ea, ie and ue. The children have been sounding them out, identifying words with these sounds in them and spelling words with these sounds on their whiteboards. The children have also been studying frogs this month with their very own frogspawn and tadpoles in the classroom. As our writing genre this month is persuasive writing, the children wrote some very persuasive pieces on why frogs are the best pets. Apparently there is no cleaning up after them and they eat household pests like flies!








Numeracy

In numeracy this month, the boys and girls have been learning about the story of 9. The children combined and partitioned numbers to make 9. The children used many concrete resources to do this, links, numicons, counters and cubes. The children have also been focusing on their number formation this month, concentrating on writing their numbers correctly.





Gaeilge

In Gaeilge this month, our theme has been Sa Bhaile (in the home). The children are learning the following vocabulary – doras (door), simléar (chimney), fuinneog (window), díon (roof), teach (house). The children are also learning that counting people in Irish uses different words than counting normally – duine amháin (one person), beirt (two people), triúr (three people), ceathrar (four people) and cúigear (five people).

Aistear



At the beginning of Aistear this month, the boys and girls celebrated the Chinese New Year and Valentine's Day. Last week, as it was Engineering Week the children made insects out of recycled materials, made patterns out of lego, built paper towers and used some bee bots to practice their coding! This week in Aistear, the children are exploring frogs and their life cycle.







The boys and girls are proving to be budding gardeners as their 'Jack and the Beanstalk' beans they planted at the beginning of February are doing very well!
