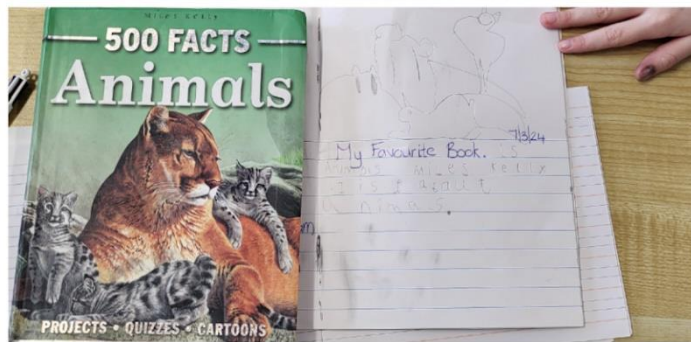
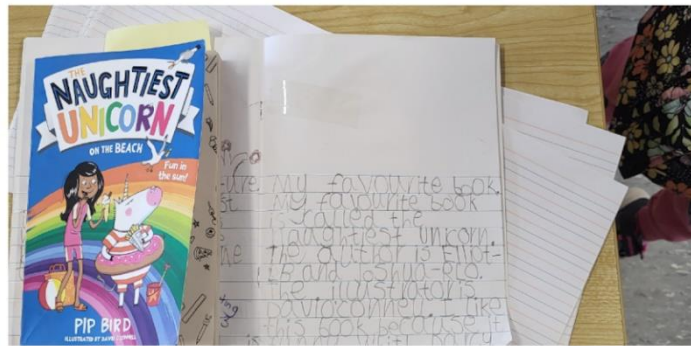
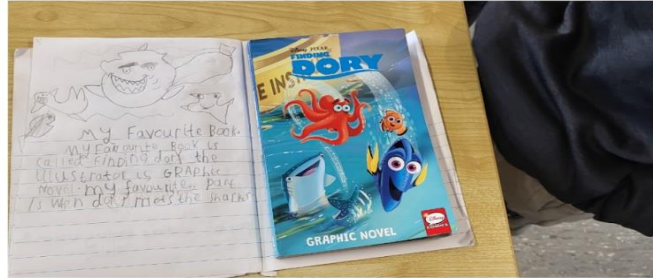
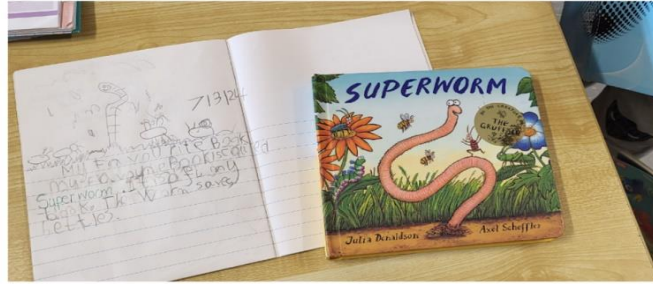
March has flown by so fast. Once again, first class have been very busy. Here is just a glimpse of all the fun and exciting learning that has been taking place.

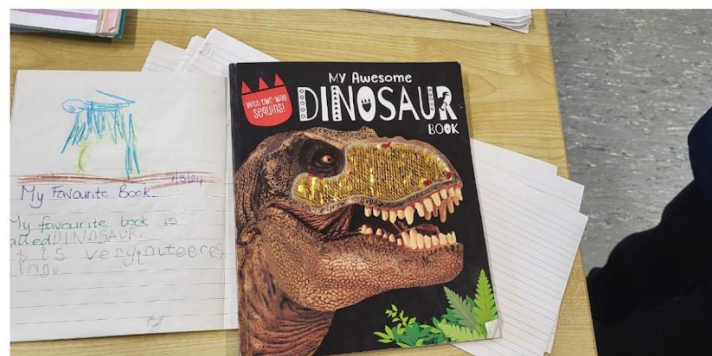
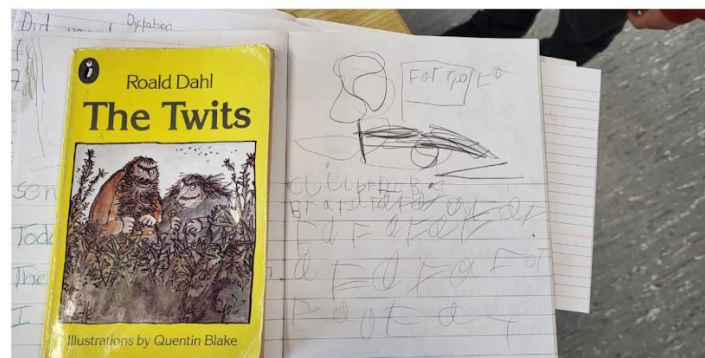
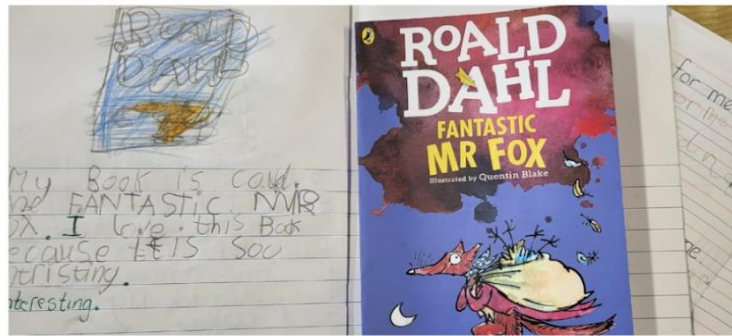
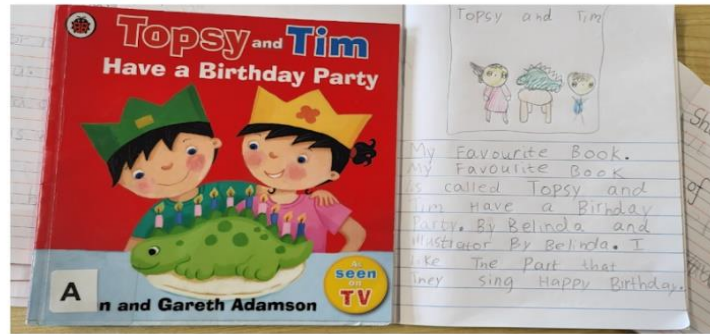
### World Book Day.

We had loads of fun learning about Oisín in Tír na nÓg.



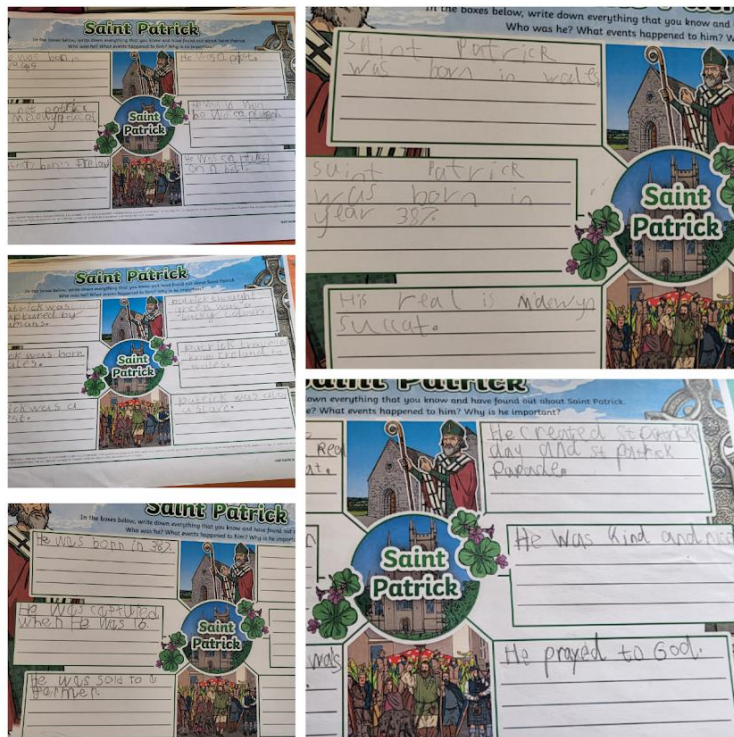
Micheal taught us all about Irish musical instruments.



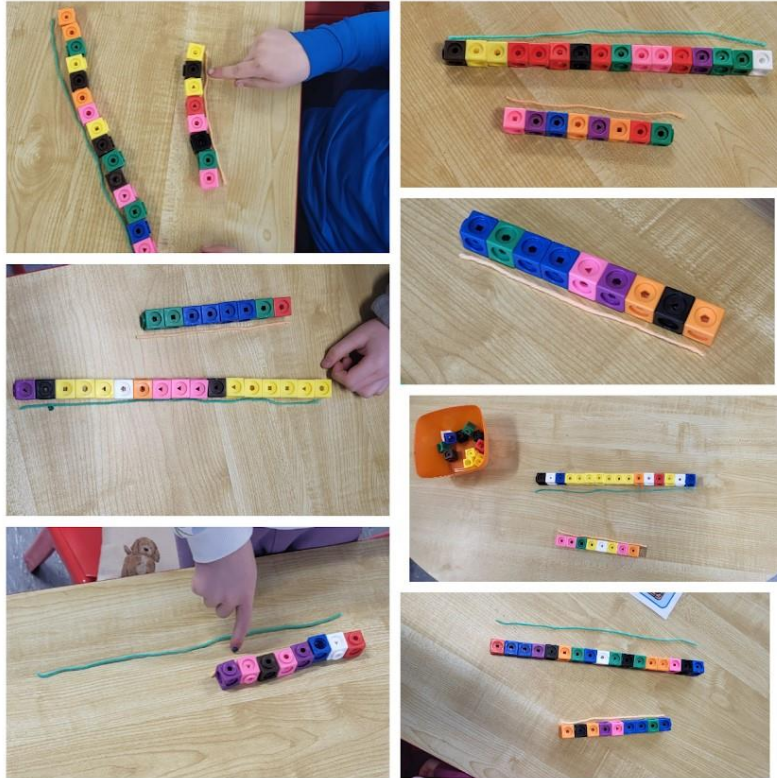
Stephen came in and played Irish songs on the tin whistle for us. He was really good and we really enjoyed listening.



We enjoyed learning about Saint Patrick. We wrote a report about all the facts we learned. Our independent writing is developing so well and we are having so much fun.



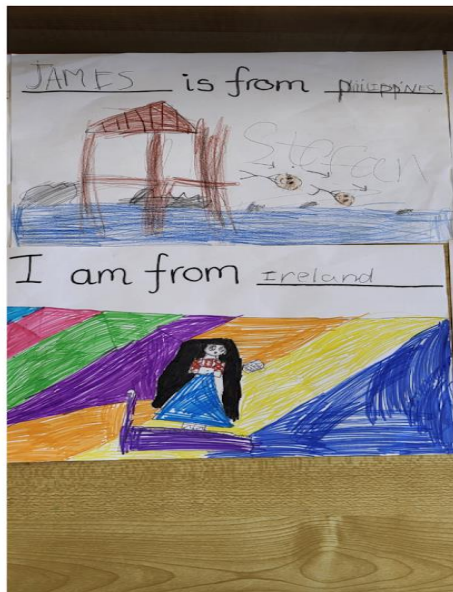
**Maths:**

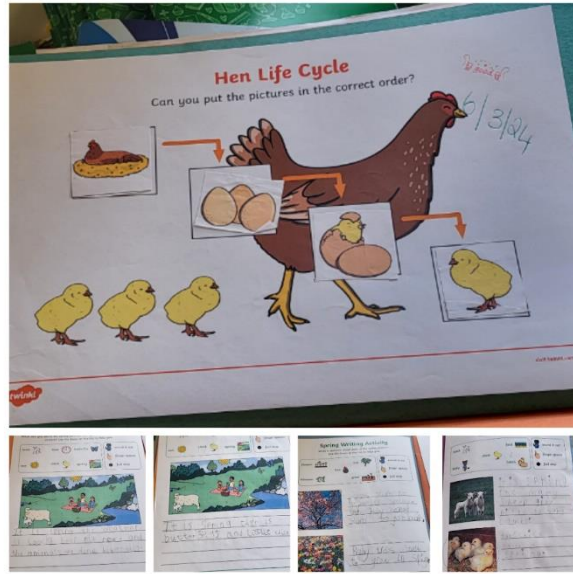




**Science:**
