Below is a brief overview of what we got up to during March:

Literacy

During Literacy this month, the boys and girls have been working tremendously hard on their writing. We have put a big emphasis on letter formation and writing sentences into their copies. The boys and girls have been identifying titles, capital letters and full stops. This month, we have also been learning the phonograms -ain, -ail, -eat, -ead and -oat. We then moved onto blending some consonants, bl, br, cl, cr, fl, tr, fr, dr, gl, gr, pl and pr. We also celebrated World Book Day this month and it was wonderful to see the boys and girls bringing in and speaking about their favourite books.



Numeracy

In numeracy this month, the boys and girls have been learning about the story of 10. The children combined and partitioned numbers to make 10 using various concrete resources. The children have started to combine three numbers totalling to 10. During Seachtain na Gaeilge, the boys and girls played 'Preabadh na Liathróide' to practise counting to 10 as Gaeilge.

Gaeilge

During Gaeilge this month, the children celebrated many great things about Ireland with an emphasis on Irish as a spoken language. Senior Infants put in a great effort in speaking Gaeilge throughout the school day. Below are some pictures of the children enjoying Seachtain na Gaeilge.
