During April the children have been learning all about eadaí. We have a Fashion show as gaeilge planned for the first week in June. The children have described different items of clothing and developed appropriate phrases and vocabulary associated with this topic. They have worked hard and done this all while speaking as gaeilge. ## <u>SESE</u>

This month we have revised what we learnt at the start of the school year about bees for world bee day on the 20<sup>th</sup> of May. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> class understand how important water is to us all. This month we learnt about the water cycle and how we use water, we also discussed ways to conserve and reuse water at home and in school.

## Numeracy

In May we completed the majority of the numeracy curriculum for the year and we are now revising some of the key aspects of it. We have incorporated a problem solving approach to this. The students became data detectives and solved a crime by using matamatical strategies and skills. While the students showing how they work out a problem is really important we have recently challenged the class to be able to support their answers by orally explanning how they got it. This has been done through a variety of maths games where maths talk is encouraged.





## <u>English</u>

The children have been working on their explanation, recount and free writing this month. They have also worked hard on the SRA reading programme which is designed to improve their comprehension skills and has differentiated levels so that all children in the class can benefit from it. A big thank you must go to our SET teachers Leigh and Sarah for their work on this with the students in the class.

It has been a great to be able to spend lots of time outside the classroom over the last month. It promises to be a very exciting end to the school year with our school tour, culture day and sports day all taking place in June. The children are busy preparing for these events and we can't wait to share them with the school community.
