1st class








2nd class











October has seen 2nd class learning all about procedural writing. This was supported by team teaching which took place in the class every Tuesday and Thursday. Impressively some children completed procedural writing tasks in English and also in their home languages.

In Irish the children learnt new frasaí to support their spoken Irish. They also learnt about Oíche Samhna and revised the days/months of the year. During maths week Rosín and Jitka came in to talk about how they use maths everyday in their jobs, they also did some activities with the children which they really enjoyed.
