To follow on our learning about making pizza, all the learners used their explanation writing skills and wrote a piece, explaining how to make a pizza. I was so proud of all their hard work.




We have also enjoyed welcoming Spring in and created a 'peek into spring'

1st class


This month, First Class delved into Explanatory Writing as their writing genre. The boys and girls are getting very familiar with the First Steps 7 steps to a writing genre. They wrote some excellent explanatory pieces for example the life cycle of a butterfly and how to make a snowman. It is wonderful to see the boys and girls' confidence in their writing grow so much throughout the year.



During PE this month, we have been focusing on team sports and working together as part of a team. It has been great to watch such sportsmanship and leadership from some of the children.



2nd class



During February the children in 2nd class learnt all about Eadaí in Gaeilge. They took part in comprehension groups with Jacqui and Aoife on Mondays and finished off their maths stations which were based on fractions for January and February. Next month the children will be doing numbers work for their maths stations and focussing on narrative writing which is the writing genre the whole school is doing in March. During this month the children also finished their swimming lessons. The children engaged really well with these lessons and learnt an important life skill, while also gaining some independence by learning to take care of their possessions. Everyone in the class is looking forward to an exciting few weeks ahead before the end of the second school term.

3rd/4th class

3rd and 4th Class have had a great month. Woodstock ETNS attended The FAI 5-a-side tournament for the first time. We had a great day and got to play lots of games against different schools from around Wicklow.



We learned about The Normans in history. The children found out that many Irish surnames (such as Barry, Belton, Butler, Cusack, D'Arcy, Devereux, Dillon, Fay, Fleming, Fitzgerald, Lambert, Nugent, Plunkett, Roche, Sinnott, Taafe, Tobin, Tuite and Wall) can be traced back to the Normans. We also learned about Norman Castles and found out that the Black Castle in Wicklow Town was actually built by The Normans!

In Maths, Sarah Jane has been coming into our classroom recently to help us with our work on our Fractions Stations. During these stations, we split into four groups with two groups working on fractions independently and the other two groups working on fractions with a teacher. Each group swaps so that they get a turn on each station. It has been great to see the children's understanding of fractions developing as they work in these smaller groups.
