1st class

They had great fun building ramps to see whose toy car would go the furthest length. The boys and girls also explored symmetry this month and found lines of symmetry in everyday items around them.



2nd class



March was an exciting time in 2nd class. We had Sophie, a student teacher working with us who did a lot of exciting lessons that all of the children really enjoyed including making parachutes! Aoife taught the whole class a new game as gaeilge and did some cool art lessons with them. We celebrated Lá Fhéile Pádraig with our lá glas, our whole school assembly and through our gaeilge lessons during the month.

We continued our team teaching with Jacqui and worked on our comprehension skills. Children were focusing on their tone of voice when reading, making connections and predictions when reading also. We also celebrated world book day this month too. Designing our classroom door in the style of the *13th storey treehouse* book which we read earlier this year. Narrative writing was another area of focus this month and the children enjoyed creating amazing stories after learning how to structure a story through our lessons in class.

3rd/4th class

In March, 3rd and 4th class learned about 3D shapes. We learned about the names of different 3D shapes and how to describe them based on their faces, edges and vertices. The students used cocktail sticks and blu-tac to create their own 3D shapes.
